ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- Currently a regular, full-time employee with at least 18 months of continuous TPWD service.
- Must be demonstrating satisfactory work performance.
- Must not have received a formal disciplinary action in the preceding 18 months prior to application submission.
- Currently enrolled in an accredited job-related degree program, i.e. relates to any Texas Parks and Wildlife Department career field.
- Must maintain a minimum GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale or pass on a pass/fail system.
- Must not be participating in the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department Education Assistance Program.

DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED

- A completed scholarship application
- A course curriculum/degree plan
- An official transcript
- Two letters of recommendation
- Certification from supervisor that Eligibility Criteria are met (may be submitted in any format)

SELECTION PROCESS

The selection of applications will be based on objective business-related criteria such as:

- Documented performance/success factors, e.g. performance plans.
- Contributions to the department in the field of natural and/or cultural resource conservation or in their profession.
- Is the educational goal related to a Texas Parks and Wildlife Department career field?
- Will the educational goal develop staff resources to fill critical shortage positions (positions that do not generate a diverse applicant pool despite recruitment efforts)?
- Will the educational opportunity promote access to non-traditional jobs?
- Other objective business-related criteria determined by the selection team.

SCHOLARSHIP PAYMENT

Scholarship payment will be made upon successful completion of the semester and evidence of final grade has been submitted (grade report, receipts for tuition, books, supplies and any other school-related expenses). Payment will be dependent on recipient maintaining overall GPA of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.

PARKS AND WILDLIFE CONSERVATION SCHOLARSHIP

The Parks and Wildlife Conservation Scholarship is managed by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Foundation, the nonprofit partner of the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD). The Parks and Wildlife Conservation Scholarship Program is comprised of three funds:

- The Andrew Sansom Expo Scholarship Fund
- The Arch Hollingsworth Scholarship Fund
- The Larry McEachron Memorial Scholarship fund

Scholarships are offered to current employees, graduating high school students and college students seeking undergraduate or postgraduate degrees related to natural and cultural resource conservation. Scholarships are also offered to TPWD employees who are seeking certifications, licenses or specialized skills that may qualify them for future job vacancies and enhance opportunities for advancement within career fields at TPWD.

As part of the review process, additional consideration will be given for any one of the following:

- TPWD employees and their immediate family
- Applicants who have served as TPWD interns in the Coastal Fisheries Division
- Applicants who reside in any of the following Texas counties:
