**ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA**

**GRADUATING HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT**

- Eligible to work in the United State (pursuant to INS requirements).
- Accepted in an accredited degree program related to natural resource conservation.
- Is ranked in the top quarter of the high school class or has a minimum GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale or a minimum of 850 on the SAT or 21 on the ACT.

**COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY STUDENT**

- Meet all the requirements listed above.
- Attend an accredited college or university.
- Undergraduates must maintain a minimum of 12 hours per semester; graduate students must be enrolled as a full-time student.
- Is enrolled in a degree program related to natural resource conservation.
- Has an overall GPA of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale or pass on a pass/fail system.

**DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED**

**HIGH SCHOOL**

- A completed scholarship application
- Two letters of recommendation
- An official high school transcript (to include class rank and/or GPA); **OR** an official record of completion of high school requirements (GED), and an official college entrance examination score report with qualifying scores as follows: a minimum SAT score of 850 or minimum ACT score of 21
- An official acceptance notice from an accredited college or university
- A copy of official degree plan

**COLLEGE**

- A completed scholarship application
- Two letters of recommendation
- An official college transcript
- A copy of official degree plan

**SELECTION PROCESS**

Applications will be reviewed for eligibility and will be considered on the basis of the following selection criteria:

**Work/Volunteer**

- Honor and awards from, and participation in, activities, endeavors, volunteer work and work, etc. related to the field of natural or cultural resource conservation.

**Academic:**

- SAT or ACT score
- High school/college grade point average

**SCHOLARSHIP PAYMENT**

Scholarship payment will be made upon successful completion of the semester and evidence of final grade has been submitted (grade report, receipts for tuition, books, supplies and any other school-related expenses). Payment will be dependent on recipient maintaining overall GPA of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.

## PARKS AND WILDLIFE CONSERVATION SCHOLARSHIP

The Parks and Wildlife Conservation Scholarship is managed by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Foundation, the nonprofit partner of the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD). The Parks and Wildlife Conservation Scholarship Program is comprised of three funds:

- The Andrew Sansom Expo Scholarship Fund
- The Arch Hollingsworth Scholarship Fund
- The Larry McEachron Memorial Scholarship fund

Scholarships are offered to current employees, graduating high school students and college students seeking undergraduate or postgraduate degrees related to natural and cultural resource conservation. Scholarships are also offered to TPWD employees who are seeking certifications, licenses or specialized skills that may qualify them for future job vacancies and enhance opportunities for advancement within career fields at TPWD.

As part of the review process, additional consideration will be given for any one of the following:

- TPWD employees and their immediate family
- Applicants who have served as TPWD interns in the Coastal Fisheries Division
- Applicants who reside in any of the following Texas counties:
