
# Who needs wild things and wild places?

#### Engage

2023 marked IOO years of Texas State Parks, and Texas' wild places were on full display for the millions who celebrated and experienced firsthand the wonders of our state park system.

Dawn and Randy Bissell are an enthusiastic two among these millions. Together, they have volunteered for years at Mustang Island State Park, from picking up trash on the beach to developing and facilitating special visitor programs. In 2019, the two lifelong geoscientists became Texas Master Naturalists and grew even more engaged with the parks along Texas' Coastal Bend.

"Being right here on the water in front of the ocean's natural vista, it's an openness you can see forever. It's been amazing to get involved and become advocates to protect these special places," said Dawn. "To have the natural classroom of a state park and the opportunity to share our expertise as volunteers, it's a hugely gratifying feeling," added Randy.

As part of the centennial celebration, Texas Parks and Wildlife Foundation (TPWF) raised \$2 million to bring priority projects to life at all 88 state parks. This milestone effort was led by our Centennial Champions – Fondren Foundation, The John M. O'Quinn Foundation, The Elkins Foundation, The J.W. Couch Foundation, and The James A. "Buddy" Davidson Charitable Foundation – who collectively offered a \$1 million match.

Countless philanthropic organizations, businesses, and individuals answered the call, including the Bissells, who earmarked their donation for the parks closest to their hearts: Mustang Island, Goose Island, and Lake Corpus Christi state parks.

Thanks to campaign support, new projects at all state parks are now underway, including the installation of new heavy-duty shade structures on the Bissells' favorite beach, Mustang Island.

#### Conserve

#### **Steward**

Corky Kuhlmann has walked just about every acre in Texas. His innate talent for unearthing wild land opportunities has driven his lifelong dedication to conserving the Texas wild.

Corky joined Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) in 1980, amid the Golden Age of Texas State Parks. During this time, over 30 parks were added, and Corky stakes the rare claim of having worked in all state parks, fish hatcheries, and almost all Wildlife Management Areas in Texas, first as a surveyor and finally as the senior project manager of TPWD's Land Conservation Program.

With his trademark overalls and authentic charm, Corky has initiated countless conversations with landowners in his mission to conserve Texas habitats, including the landmark acquisition of Old Baldy at Garner State Park in 2010. According to Corky, "At Garner, there are three main things to do: tubing, dancing, and hiking. For generations, Old Baldy was private land. Had we not inked that deal when it went up for sale, it would've put an end to the third major attraction at Garner!"

Palo Duro Canyon's Fortress Cliff is another win topping his list. "Every campsite inside the canyon looks up on that cliff. Without that deal, there'd be houses all along that bluff."


In 2016, Corky retired from TPWD only to join TPWF as our Land Conservation Manager. With TPWF, he has completed a dozen more deals, forever conserving thousands of acres, including the 2,178-acre Burns Ranch in 2023. Now protected as the Paul and Toni Burns Wildlife Management Area, this rare property is located in the Cross Timbers and Plains Ecological Region and provides essential grassland habitat and sustenance for hundreds of native and migratory species.

Margaret Martin's longtime connection to the outdoors has inspired a lifelong commitment to conservation. Always active in her rural ranching community near Laredo, Margaret served on various local agriculture-focused boards before being appointed to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission in 2007.

"That experience changed my life. I didn't realize the vast scope of TPWD's purview until I joined the Commission. TPWD touches so many things that Texans hold dear," said Martin.

After eight years on the Commission, Martin joined TPWF's Board in 2016, where she is a devoted champion of TPWF's Gear Up for Game Wardens program. "I may be short in stature, but I'm a big mama bear when it comes to our game wardens!"

Margaret serves on Gear Up's Leadership Committee, where she energetically drives awareness and support for the program. In 2023, Gear Up for Game Wardens funded and secured 863 specialty items valued at \$1.8 million. From airboats to K-9 units to life-saving thermal drones and more, Margaret and thousands of ardent supporters are outfitting Texas Game Wardens with the equipment they need to safeguard Texas' lands, waters, wildlife, and people.


In 2023, following his board fellowship, Brad was officially elected to TPWF's Board of Directors, where he brings to the table an entirely new generational perspective.


